

NEW MEXICO CAPTURES TRACK & FIELD TITLE



National Track and Field Champions
New Mexico Junior College

New Mexico Junior College of Hobbs won the 31st annual NJCAA Track and Field Championship outlasting runner-up Odessa Junior College of Odessa, Texas, at Mesa, Arizona. The New Mexico Thunderbirds needed four points going into the night's final event, the mile relay, and finished fourth to pick up enough points to capture the championship by one point. Mesa Community College, four time defending national champion finished third.

Nine meet records were broken in the three night track and field spectacular. Top performance came from distance ace Reggie McAfee of Brevard College, Brevard, North Carolina, who set new records in the mile and two mile.

The high point award for the meet went to Odessa's Willie Harrison who collected 20½ points. Ross Black, head track coach of New Mexico Junior College was named "Coach of the Year" by the NJCAA Track Coaches Association.

Nassau Community College repeats as NJCAA LaCrosse Champions

Nassau Community College, Garden City, New York, won its second straight NJCAA Invitational Lacrosse title, defeating SUNY at Farmingdale, 9-4, on the astro-turf at Hofstra Stadium, Hempstead, New York.

In first round play the Nassau Lions romped over Corning Community College 17-3, while SUNY at Farmingdale defeated Anne Arundel CC 16-3 to move into the championship round. In the consolation game Anne Arundel stopped Corning 9-4 to take third place.

Nassau, the defending champion, opened the scoring at 3:33 of the first period on a goal by Steve McDonald. The Aggies tied the score at 7:34 of the first period on a goal by Gonzales. This was the closest Farmingdale was to come as Nassau's August, Olson and Lucas added goals in the last 3 minutes of the period to make the score 4-1. The score at halftime was 6-2 in favor of the Lions.

Completely dominating play in the second half, Nassau went on to win the championship 9-4 as Coach Richard Speckman's Lions bottled up the Aggies with a superb defense.
