

- ___ 11. He aids in the evaluation of the football program and team personnel at end of football season.
- ___ 12. He encourages class attendance, grades, and moral conduct of players.
- ___ 13. He keeps the head coach informed of any morale problems.
- ___ 14. He assists in recruiting prospects in the off season when it does not conflict with other coaching assignments.

II. Evaluation of Practice Duties:

- ___ 15. He assists in moving practice equipment on and off practice field.
- ___ 16. He is well organized in his practice break down drills.
- ___ 17. He observes and instructs, as assigned by the Head Coach, the group work done during the specialist time and during the conditioning period.
- ___ 18. He observes and instructs his assigned group during team demonstrations and scrimmages.
- ___ 19. He makes critical evaluations of practices to the Head Coach during daily staff meetings.
- ___ 20. He is prepared for staff meetings that are called by the Head Coach.
- ___ 21. He helps supervise the locker room before and after practice.
- ___ 22. He cooperates with managers, trainers, and assists with taping before practice.
- ___ 23. He accepts his share of responsibility for team spirit and morale by showing enthusiasm in his actions on and off the field.

III. Evaluation of Game Duties:

- ___ 24. He accepts the responsibility for his assigned group of players during game time.
- ___ 25. He accepts his responsibility if assigned to the press box and provides the head coach with information needed to run the team.
- ___ 26. He assists with bench discipline if on side-line during game time.
- ___ 27. He assists the trainer with taping and other miscellaneous duties before game time.
- ___ 28. He assists with equipment needs during game time.
- ___ 29. He assists with plotting opponents defense and offense on summary sheets during course of game.
- ___ 30. He assists with after game duties.

Mike Anderson Wins NJCAA Decathlon Title



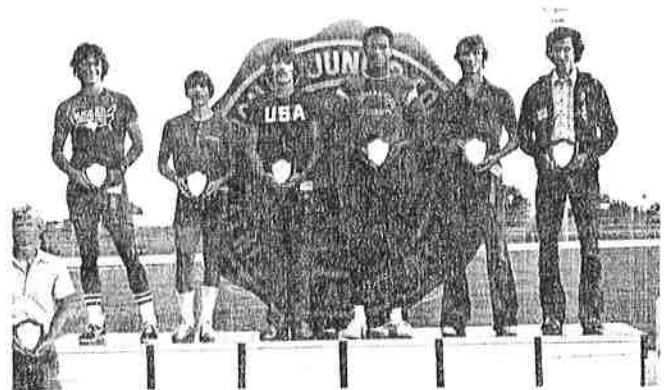
Mike Anderson, Brevard College, Brevard, North Carolina

Mike Anderson from Brevard College, Brevard, North Carolina won the 2nd Annual NJCAA Decathlon Championship held at San Jacinto College, Pasadena, Texas. Eight entries came to compete for the title of best all-around junior college track and field athlete in the nation.

In the first day's action, Mike Thompson of Florissant Valley Community College led the field, with victories in the long jump and high jump, second in the 100 meters, and a fourth in the 400 meters. Close behind was Mike Anderson of Brevard College who won the shot put, the 400 meters, and was third in the 100 meters. Matt Smith of Odessa College was in third place after the first day of competition, scoring high in all five events.

The second day Mike Anderson won the discus, placed second in the 110 meter hurdles, third in the pole vault and javelin, and fourth in the 1500 meters to win the National Championship. The leader of the first day's competition, Mike Thompson, suffered an injury early in the second day's events and slipped to fourth place in the final standings. Keven Tarpinning of Lane Community College moved all the way from fifth place the first day to capture the runner-up position in the final standings. Tarpinning was first in the javelin with a distance of 186'8", first in the pole vault with a height of 13'5 1/2", third in the discus and 110 meter hurdles, and fifth in the 1500 meters during the second day of competition.

The 2nd Annual NJCAA Decathlon Championship was considered to be highly successful. Since the meet is now being held the Tuesday and Wednesday prior to the National Track & Field Championships, it is hoped that more and more athletes will be entering the Decathlon competition.

Mesa, Arizona Wins NJCAA Track and Field Championships

1974 National Track and Field Champions

Mesa Community College, Mesa, Arizona won the 34th Annual NJCAA Track and Field Championships held at San Jacinto college, Pasadena, Texas. In winning its fifth championship in the last seven years, Mesa scored 72 points to outdistance Essex County College, New Jersey who finished second with 54 points.

Eight meet records were broken and one tied in this year's meet. Ralph Haynie of Central Arizona reached 17' ¼" in the pole vault which betters all existing junior college records. Ron Senkiw of Mesa, Arizona pushed the slot 62'10" to also better all existing junior college records. Other records broken were by Glen Wilburn of Lincoln Land in the six mile with a time of 29:13.7, Fletcher Lewis of Nebraska Southern in the long jump with a distance of 26' ¾", the Mesa, Arizona 440 yard relay team with a time of 40.4, George Haley of Lincoln Land in the 440 intermediate hurdles with a time of 51.3, and Bernard Rose of Odessa in the three mile with a time of 14:00.3. John McCollum of Mesa, Arizona bettered the 100 yard dash record in the semi-finals with a time of 9.3, but finished second in the finals. Rodney Price of Eastern Oklahoma tied the 120 high hurdles record in the semifinals, but finished third in the finals.

The high point man for the meet went to Donald Merrick of Seminole Junior College, Florida. Carvel Jackson of Mesa, Arizona was named track "Coach of the Year" by the NJCAA Track Coaches Association.
